2017-18

The Industrial visit for the Academic Year 2017-18 was scheduled to MUMBAI-OOTY COONNOR-MYSORE-BANGALORE-MUMBAI. Period of Industrial Visit: 31st Jan 2018 to 7th Feb 2018



Industrial Visit (I.V): first year and second students of SICS had visited to Ooty-Mysore-Bangalore for Industrial Visit for 7 days from 31st Jan 2018 to 7th Feb 2018. Total 131 students along with 4 faculties had gone for I.V. It was a great learning along with practical real life experiences for the students. Industrial Visit 2021-2022/ 2022-2023 Industrial Visit to Chandigarh-Manali-Solang-Manikaran
Period of Industrial Visit 26th February 2023 to 6th March



The Industrial Visit to Chandigarh-Manali-Solang-Manikaran was organized from 26th February 2023 to 6th March

Industries visited were "Inter Solar Systems Pvt. Ltd." and "Amulya Herbs Pvt. Ltd." Chandigarh. These two visits were very beneficial to the students as they gained the actual industrial knowledge.

In Kullu the students visited the Kullu Shawl Factory where handmade woolen garments as well as machine made were being manufactured and sold. Women empowerment was clearly visible in the factory as it had more than 60% women employees. Students learnt about the shawl manufacturing process and techniques for framing designs. They learnt that Kullu shawls were woven by tapestry technique of weaving using pure wool only creating intricate multi-color strong geometrical patterns. They were also informed about how to identify a genuine Kullu shawl against a fake one.
